
CHECK-POINT

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION FOR PRESENT FIRST YEAR STUDENTS RETURNING TO FANSHAWE IN SEPTEMBER 1970

A "General Application for Admission to a College of Applied Arts and Technology" form has recently been distributed to Ontario Secondary Schools.

This form is being used only by a few of the Community Colleges in Ontario. It does not meet the needs of Fanshawe College and has not been approved by this College.

Anyone interested in applying for admission to Fanshawe College should do so only by completing the Fanshawe College Application for Admission form now available at the Registrar's Office.

Students presently attending Fanshawe College who expect to register in September 1970 are reminded that they must complete an application form. Returning students are required to complete only Page 1 of the form. No other information or documentation is required.

Since the Application Fee has been eliminated this year, there is no reason why every returning student should not complete an application form before the end of this school year. This will insure consideration for a place in the succeeding year as we are now receiving many requests for transfer from other Community Colleges. It will also enable the College staff to plan more accurately for 1970-71. (Memo from Registrar's Office).
