DON'T FORGET! SUPPLEMENTAL EXAMS!

Students who are taking one semester courses, which will terminate January 16, may find they have to, or want to, write supplemental exams.

EXAMS ARE TO BE WRITTEN WEDNESDAY JANUARY 21 AND THURSDAY JANUARY 22. SOME DIVISIONS WILL ALSO HOLD SUPPLEMENTAL EXAMS TUESDAY JANUARY 20.

If you plan to write a supplemental exam, this is the procedure you must follow:

1. Go to the Registrar's office in the Arts Centre and register to take each exam you wish to write, no later than Tuesday, January 20th.
2. Pay \$2.00 for each exam you have registered to write.
3. Be sure to obtain and keep a receipt for each exam for which you register.

NOTE: This receipt must be presented to the instructor in charge at the time you write each exam.

4. Check carefully the timetable of supplemental exams in order to ensure:
  - (a) the time you will write each exam
  - (b) the place where each exam will be held.

NOTE: Exam timetables will be available from the Registrar's Office. They will also be posted on the notice boards around the college.
