ARRANGEMENTS FOR WRITING SUPPLEMENTALS

The following points are brought to the attention of students who may have to write supplemental examinations this year:

- 1. Students within one day's return travel of Fanshawe College must come to the college to write their supplementals.
- 2. Students more than one day's travel from the college may arrange to write their supplementals in the following way:
- (a) By contacting a community college or technical institute within one day's return travel of where they are working and making arrangements with personnel at that particular college to contact the appropriate Division at Fanshawe. The Division will then contact the person direct, forward the supplemental, and have that person invigilate the exam.
- (b) If no college or technical institute is within one day's return travel, the student may contact a high school principal to get in touch with Fanshawe College. The Divisions concerned will then get in touch with the supervising person.
- (c) In all cases, where there are additional supervisory costs, these will be borne by the student. The student must still pay the registration fee for supplemental examinations to Fanshawe College:
