The program in the school has altered, the name of the school has been changed four times but the underlying philosophy of "caring of and for the patient" has remained constant.


We would suggest to you that you have, through heritage and education now an obligation to make the contribution that only you can make in whatever situation you may be. Nothing you may do will be meaningless.


TO THE GRADUATES

The challenge of changing methods in health continues apace and in Septem-ber 1973 we will see it come very close to home ground in the transfer of nur-sing education to Fanshawe Community College. While little apparent change may be immediately discernible the implications of the change for nursing education to an integrated system with other forms of education may be far reaching in the future.

reaching in the future. The history of nursing schools is a proud one, one which over the years has produced graduates able to take their places in the health care field and to pro-vide leadership in many ways in the changing and growing atmosphere and the increasing complexities of the health care system. Those of us who have been intimately involved with the Schools of Nursing and their close relationships with the hospitals where the students acquire their vital clinical experience have some feelings of ambivalence about the change, we are concerned about the bigness of community colleges and the 'depersonaliza-tion' of big systems, particularly when education in nursing is so deeply con-cerned with relationships with the patient as a person. On the other side, how-ever, it must be admitted that nursing is stretching out into a much broader area and nurses will continue to find themselves in new situations with new res-ponsibilities as the health care field continues to expand. The community colarea and nurses will continue to find themselves in new situations with new res-ponsibilities as the health care field continues to expand. The community col-lege may well be able, with its greater resources, to provide a broader back-ground to enable the nurse to cope with and become accustomed to the new areas of our health care society. The college may also be able to assist is cop-ing with the fragmentation which impedes our health care system since it will be dealing with the whole field and range of health care system since it will be dealing with the whole field and range of health care service personnel. To those of you who are presently graduating I say sincerely that you should feel no sense of inferiority because of the changing system, you are the graduates of a fine educational program which emphasizes all that it useful and desirable in nursing. You are competent, professional nurses and, as you take your place in your chosen area of work you will be judged and not found wanting. 






























THE CELLS STILL DIVIDE
