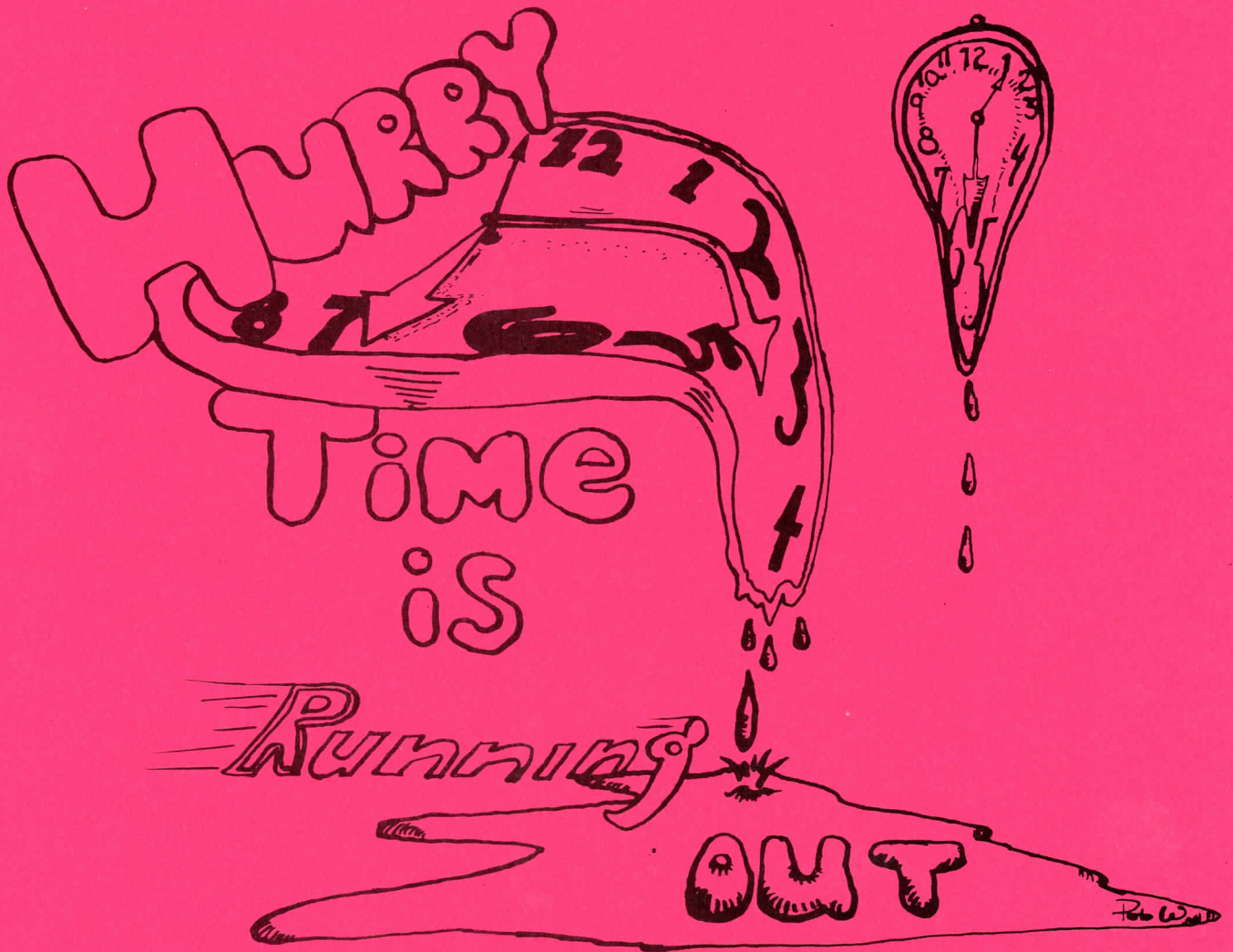

ASSOCIATION FOR THE MENTALLY RETARDED

Saturday, March 20th, 1971 will mark the 20th anniversary of the London and District Association for the Mentally Retarded. To celebrate the occasion, the Association has planned a day of events, beginning with the Annual Meeting at the H. B. Beal Secondary School at 1:30 p.m.

From 2:30 to 4:30 p.m., at the H. B. Beal Secondary School, mentally retarded young people will be participating in Sports and Recreation Demonstrations including floor hockey, basketball and baseball, swimming, trampoline and physical education programs, as well as displays by cubs, scouts, girls' club and camping participants.

Our prime purpose is to demonstrate to the public educators and people in the recreation profession the ability of the mentally retarded to participate in a variety of physical fitness and sports activities. These young people are more like than unlike normal children, and their desire to take part in and compete in sporting activities, is the same as any other child.

There will be about 100 young people taking part in the demonstrations, and we sincerely hope that you will all come out to H. B. Beal Secondary School on March 20th, to see what they have worked so hard to display. Local athletes will be on hand as honorary coaches and referees.
