### FANHSAWE CAR RALLY

The Fanshawe Rally Club will be holding its largest rally of the year this <u>Sunday</u>, <u>May 3, 1970</u>. It will be a 175 mile Navex type event, which is not recommended for the novice. ## ARTS CENTRE CLASSES TERMINATE MAY 6, 1970

It has been announced that classes of students which are headquartered in the Arts Centre will terminate on Wednesday, May 6, 1970, due to current construction in that building. This applies only to Arts Centre students. Classes in the Main Building will continue through Friday, May 15, 1970.

#### GRADUATION 1970

This year's graduation exercises will be held in Centennial Hall on Friday, May 29, 1970, at 2:30 P.M. Those students who are graduating and wish to take part in the ceremony are asked to notify their class advisors or Miss Rogers in the central office of the Main Building. ## \*ARRANGEMENTS FOR WRITING SUPPLEMENTAL EXAMINATIONS

- 1. Students within one day's return travel of Fanshawe must return to the college to write their supplementals.
- 2. Students living more than one day's return travel from the college may arrange to take their supplementals in the following ways:
  - (a) by contacting a community college or technical institute within one day's travel and making arrangements with that school to contact the appropriate division of Fanshawe to make arrangements to forward and invigilate the exam.
  - (b) if no such school is available, the student may contact a high school principal to arrange with the appropriate division at Fanshawe to administer the exam through his high school.

(c) In all cases, where there are additional supervisory costs, these will be borne by the student. The student must still pay the registration fee for supplemental examinations to Fanshawe College
