CALCULATOR CENTRE

A new college facility for use by staff and students of Fanshawe College will open in Room 306 on 12 November 1969.

The purpose of the calculator center is two-fold.

- a) to introduce the student to equipment similar to that which he or she may have to work with after graduation.
- b) to remove some of the drudgery for long tedious calculations which are a part of, but do not contribute to, new knowledge.

The calculator room will be in use during the mornings with classes scheduled in for familiarization and course requirements. The facility will be open for use by staff and students on the following trial schedule:

12 Noon until 6 p.m. -Tues., Thurs., & Fri.
1 p.m. until 6 p.m. -Mon. & Wed.

There is an instruction booklet and a record book with each machine. After the first week or two the supervising students will have become expert enough to assist anyone having difficulty.

It is hoped that staff and students will avail themselves of this new facility and that good use be made of the calculators, combined with the care and attention that any complicated and precision instrument deserves. If there are any suggestions for improvements that the faculty or students wish to make these may be given to any member of the calculator committee.
