AN APPEAL TO ALL STUDENTS

By the end of February, we hope the new cafeteria will be ready in the Annex. Until then we have to take steps to deal with the overcrowding in the Cafeteria in the Main Building.

One of the problems is that students remain seated after finishing their meals, talking, reading or playing cards. Normally we would have no objection to this, but in the present situation it means that other students may not find anywhere to sit and eat their meal.

We are therefore asking students to leave the cafeteria when they have finished their meal during the period 12:00 noon to 2:00 p.m.

I repeat: we regret the need to make this request - it is a temporary arrangement which should not be necessary when the new cafeteria opens.
