- Preference for Permanent Residents of Ontario.
- Receipt of Application by February 1st.
- Achievement in the required academic Preparation.
- Preference will be given to graduates of the Fanshawe College Journalism - Broadcast program.

Applications received by February 1st will be guaranteed consideration. Applications received after February 1st will be considered only if places remain available in the program.

Program Progression



Course Descriptions

NEWS500 - TV News Presentation

TV News presentation explores the styles and presentation used in the various TV news formats. Students will produce news stories and news briefs using field and/or studio facilities, and study the practices now in use in the industry.

NEWS501 - TV News Editing

The use of pictures and sound by the journalist to tell stories for television. Students will edit television news stories for Rogers Television and class assignments using a non linear editing system.

NEWS502 - TV News Reporting

The use of pictures and sound by the journalist to tell stories for television. Students will produce television news stories for Rogers Community 13 in the field using electronic news gathering equipment and video-tape editing suite equipment.

NEWS503 - TV News Production

The student will learn operation of electronic news gathering equipment and the production of television news stories, as a videographer. The student will be taught the procedures and techniques for an ENG unit, and basic lighting for shooting and including preparation of shot lists. In addition to technical skills, creative skills to function as a videographer, combining the skills of reporters and videographers.

NEWS600 - TV News Presentation

An application of newscast and reporting, on camera presentation skills, in studio and the field.

NEWS601 - TV News Editing

An expansion of non-linear editing techniques and styles for various news stories and programs. Students will shoot and edit news stories for Rogers Television.

NEWS602 - TV News Reporting

The use of pictures and sound by the journalist to tell stories for television. Students will produce television current events stories for Rogers Television in the field using electronic news gathering equipment and video-tape editing equipment.

NEWS603 - TV News Production

Advanced development of electronic news gathering equipment and the production of television news stories. The student will refine and develop the procedures and techniques for an ENG unit, and lighting for shooting and including preparation of shot lists and scripts.

NEWS604 - News Internship

A two month internship in a television newsroom.
